This First Special Issue on “COVID-19 and World Economy” will include up to **10-12 papers**. We will call for Special Issues on Covid-19 and World Economy for successive numbers.

Background

The change that the COVID-19 pandemic is producing will be so great at all levels that it will not require much justification for REM to have a monographic number on its effects on the world economy.

Given that we are in the midst of the ‘hurricane’, some may think that it is early to make an analysis calm enough, an opinion that we share. However, the need to act as soon as possible and not make the mistakes of previous crises, forces the economic scientific community to also put all its means into analysing and proposing measures and solutions to what is happening.

For this reason, we have subtitled this "call for papers": ‘*preliminary analysis*’. With the intention of being able to do another monographic number later to complete and rectify these analysis with better perspective.

Submissions

Papers can be written in **English or Spanish, although English is recommended since it can reach a greater audience**. The received full papers would be subject to previous editorial scrutiny and pre-selection, and to strict peer-review process before acceptance. Articles should be no more than **7,000 words in length**, including all references, notes and tables. Articles must be accompanied by an abstract

of no more than **100** words and up to five keywords. Submissions should be directed through the *Revista de Economía Mundial* (REM) on-line submission system

Possible topics: (non-exhaustive list)

- Historical reviews of other major crises and/or other pandemics and their comparison with this one.
- Forecast and analysis of the available data.
- Key factors of the successive crises that are occurring or are going to occur: health and essential public services crisis, commercial crisis especially of essential health products in the pandemic, oil crisis, economic crisis, fiscal crisis, sovereign debt crisis, financial crisis, social crisis, political crisis ...
- Policies implemented by governments and other institutions (central banks, European Commission, G20, G7 ...). Assessment of policies' opportunity, sustainability, effectiveness and efficiency.
- Consequences for economic science and its theoretical postulates and models.
- Changes that are going to take place or should take place in world economic policy. Monetary, fiscal, commercial, labour, and productive policies: agricultural, industrial, basic and / or strategic goods ...
- Changes that should take place in economic, social and strategy world organization.
- Philosophical and ethical implications and their impact on the World Economy.
- Sectoral and/or partial aspects: effects on world tourism, on global value chains in industry, logistics, transport, trade, effect on employment, effects on SMEs and the business fabric, on the financial sector, on foreign and domestic investment ...
- Side effects on the environment and global warming.
- Asymmetric effects in different regions and countries: EU, USA, China, Latin America, Africa, Asia....
- Effects for developing economies and the 2030 goals.

Timeline

Deadline for the submission of full papers: **20th June, 2020**. We will accept out time for successive numbers.

Expected publication of the First Special Section in the *Revista de Economía Mundial* (REM)/ *Journal of World Economy*: **September-December 2020**.
