## NOTE TO CONTRIBUTORS

1. Articles and reviews should be original contributions, not previously published, and not be under consideration for any other publication at the same time.

2. Please send your contributions as a Word file by e-mail attachment to the Editors (vioque@uhu.es). Submissions in printed copy should be sent to the Editors, *Exemplaria Classica*, Universidad de Huelva, Departamento de Filología, Campus de El Carmen, E-21071 Huelva (Spain). The following should also be attached: an abstract of the article in two languages (English and original language) of no more than 50 words; three key words in two languages (as for the abstract); date of final version.

3. Greek text must be written in a Unicode font, or at least in SGreek.

4. Ancient authors should be quoted in accordance with A Greek-English Lexicon ("Authors and Works", pp. XVI-XXXVIII), and *ThLL*, Leipzig 1990<sup>2</sup>: e.g., Hom. *Od.* 9.152-5; E. *Hipp.* 424-30; Pl. *Phdr.* 237d; Plaut. *Cas.* 815-24; Ov. *met.* 8.708; Sen. *benef.* 5.12.6; Arist. *Or.* 26.100; Coripp. *lust.* 1.314-33.

5. Quotations should be as follows (for Journals, please follow the abbreviations of *L'Année Philologique*):

When further quotation from an already-cited source is necessary, the procedure should be as follows. In the case of a book: author's surname (no first name), comma, abbreviated title in italics, comma, page number (no p. / pp.). E.g., Fraenkel, *Agamemnon*, 85. In the case of an article or chapter: author's surname (no first name), comma, abbreviated title and enclosed in inverted commas, comma, page number (no p. / pp.). E.g., Gaisser, "The Business of Editing", 40.

6. *Exemplaria Classica* follows a policy of anonymous referees. A title page should be attached with the title, author's name, address, and e-mail.

7. Authors will receive a hard copy of the current issue free of charge and a pdf version of their contributions.

8. *Exemplaria Classica* is currently indexed in *Emerging Sources Citation Index, Scopus,* EBSCO, *the European Index for the Humanities* (ERIH), *Latindex,* RESH, ERCE, MLA, *L'Année Philologique,* DICE, ISOC, *Gnomon, Bolletino di Studi Latini,* DIALNET, Interclassica, and CARHUS Plus.
